### What to include with your **completed application to 4C :**

Family Child Care Providers:

1. **YOUR APPLICATION.** Your application will not be processed until income verification is received.
2. **Income verification** (one of the following):
  - \*A copy of your most recent Schedule C tax form.
  - \*Copies of receipts for each of the children you care for.
  - \*A copy of your Child Care Provider Portal (CCPP) Quarterly/Monthly Payments Summary page for last month.
  - \*A signed statement detailing your weekly rate and the number of children you care for.
3. There is a \$20 non-refundable scholarship processing fee. T.E.A.C.H. will contact you directly about all information received and the fee for processing.

### **CHILDD—301**

June 2nd, 2020 - July 9th, 2020 Tuesday and Thursday - 6:30pm—8:30pm

Total Credits 3

This introductory course is designed for family childcare providers, or individuals seeking to become family child care providers. In this course, providers will fulfill the requirements for both Department of Children and Families entry level courses Fundamentals of Family Child Care and Introduction to the Child Care Profession. Through this course, providers will be introduced to important topics such as quality standards in family childcare, health and wellness, child development, curriculum planning, guiding children's behavior, program wellness, and provider health and wellness. This course must be taken first in the Family Child Care Credential series and is aligned with the Wisconsin Model Early Learning Standards and the National Association for Family Child Care Quality Standards.

### **CHILDD—302**

July 21, 2020 – August 27<sup>th</sup>, 2020 Tuesday and Thursday – 6:30 pm -8:30 pm

Total Credits 3

This second course of the Family Child Care Credential series focuses on creating responsive family child care programming with an emphasis on building relationships and curriculum. Through this course, providers will be introduced to important topics such as quality standards for relationships, intentional relationships, diversity and anti-bias perspectives, family partnerships, mixed age curriculum, learning environment indoor, and learning environment outdoor. This course is aligned with the Wisconsin Model Early Learning Standards and the National Association for Family Child Care Quality Standards.

### **CHILDD—303**

September 8, 2020 – October 15, 2020 Tuesday and Thursday – 6:30 pm -8:30 pm

Total Credits 3

This third course of the Family Child Care Credential series focuses on managing the finances of a family child care with an emphasis on principles and practices for budget planning, budget preparation, and fiscal management. Through this course, providers will be introduced to important topics such as quality standards for financial management and planning, business management, financial planning, record keeping, business budgets, marketing and financial management tools and systems. This course is aligned with the National Association for Family Child Care Quality Standards.

### **CHILDD—135**

October 20, 2020 – December 1, 2020 Tuesday and Thursday – 6:30 pm -8:30 pm

Total Credits 3

Demonstrate the integration and application of specific concepts and skills of family child care including mixed-age curriculum, quality standards, professional development, community resources, health and wellness practices, family partnerships, and financial management. This capstone experience reflects the learner's knowledge of family child care through the development of a major project. The Capstone course is the last course students take prior to completing the Family Child Care Credential.
