YoungStar News and Updates

In November 2021, the Department of Children and Families (DCF) issued its required, regularly scheduled, Request for Proposal for the administration of the YoungStar Quality Rating and Improvement System. Following an extensive process, the department issued an intent to award the contract to Shine Early Learning and is currently finalizing the contract. Shine Early Learning will administer all YoungStar services after a transition period with the current YoungStar administrator, Supporting Families Together Association (SFTA). Although transition and contract details are being finalized, we expect Shine to administer all YoungStar services by spring 2023.

Shine Early Learning, SFTA, and DCF are all committed to working together on a smooth transition, with uninterrupted, high-quality YoungStar services. Although your YoungStar local office, consultant, and/or rater may be changing, many things will remain the same. Throughout the transition and beyond, you can expect the following:

- Shine Early Learning staff will be using the same criteria as the current consultants to complete your rating, and the DCF-planned rating criteria change will not occur until early 2025 at the earliest.
- If you have already been rated by YoungStar, and need to be rated again, you will continue to hold your current rating until YoungStar staff are able to complete a new rating.
- YoungStar staff and local regional offices will continue to be located across Wisconsin, similar to the current model.
- Onsite consultation visits will continue to be an option within YoungStar for any program that requests it. DCF is committed to ensuring that all programs have access to onsite support now, and in the future.
- Providers will be able to select onsite consultation, virtual consultation, group consultation with other providers, and/or access to an online resource site. Providers will be asked to decide which type, how much, and which delivery method (virtual or onsite) of consultation they prefer.
- SFTA and the Child Care Resource and Referral agencies will continue providing:
 - $\,\circ\,$ Resources and referrals for families and providers
 - $\circ\,$ Trainings and technical assistance for families and providers
 - Free foundational trainings
 - Support for tribal nations
 - Outreach and recruitment for certification and pre-licensing
 - $\circ\,$ Project Growth activities including Partner Up! and Business Child Care Advocates
- Currently, Shine Early Learning is building a local, Wisconsin team of consultants, coaches, and raters. YoungStar staff and local regional offices will continue to be located across Wisconsin, similar to the current model.

Child Care Counts Updates

(DCF) has allocated \$351 million in funds for the Child Care Counts: Stabilization Payment Program to support Wisconsin's early care and education community. The Stabilization Payment Program Round 2 is a 9 month payment program that runs through April 2023 followed by an additional 9 month payment program, with the renewal application opening in May 2023.

The next application/update period is January 17-21, 2023.

✓ Menus – Daily entry of menus and current attendance sheet will be checked for completion

✓ Sanitation- The following area will be checked for sanitation:

- Handwashing
- Refrigerator & freezer temperature
- General cleanliness
- Garbage storage
- Food storage

 \checkmark USDA Meal Pattern- Whole Grain Rich products, Milk, Yogurt, Cereal, Combination Foods

- ✓ Copy of Forms- Copies of:
 - Current menu & attendance forms
 - $\circ~$ Approved Income eligibility letter to claim your own children
 - Claim Error letters
 - Child Enrollment forms
 - Past home review visits
 - Original DPI Application and Agreement forms
 - Annual training certificate
- Current license or certificate posted
- Discussion of Nutrition and Healthy Meals

What is Behavior Help Wisconsin?

Behavior Help Wisconsin is a program that helps early childhood care and education providers who feel challenged by the behavior of a child. Behavior Help Coaches provide one-on-one coaching to the child's parents/guardians and care provider to equip you with tools, knowledge, and skills to reduce challenging behaviors and promote positive ones.





Our evidence-based approach strengthens the social-emotional

development of young children as identified in the Wisconsin Model Early Learning Standards. If you are feeling challenged by a child's behavior and aren't sure what else to try, Behavior Help Wisconsin can provide you with strategies that will encourage positive behaviors and strengthen your relationship with the child. **Visit our website for more information**: <u>https://www.4cfc.org/bhw/</u>

Behavior Help Wisconsin is currently a pilot program operating only in certain areas of the state (Chippewa, Dunn, and St. Croix counties, and the City of Milwaukee). If you are not located in a pilot area, you can receive alternative support from your local Child Care Resource & Referral Agency (CCR&R).

Have you heard of the Partner Up! Grant Program?

Partner Up! is a new state initiative focused on helping businesses secure affordable child care for employees. Business participants in Partner Up! can reserve slots in regulated local child care programs.

With the Partner Up! Program, 75% of the cost of child care can be paid through a government grant. The business would need to cover the remaining 25% of the true cost of care, but could contribute more.

Employees will receive accessible high-quality childcare at little to no out of pocket cost to them. The child care facilities will receive the True Cost of Care as determined by DCF each month.

Any extra funds over tuition for the children enrolled in a child care center can be used in a number of different ways to improve the business (i.e. Training or upgrades to the facility for example.) Visit our website for more information. <u>https://www.4cfc.org/partner-up-grant-program/</u>
